## FY2018 Federal Budget dynamics

- Debt Ceiling extended to December 8<sup>th</sup>.
- Tax Reform
- Annual Budget extended to December 8<sup>th</sup>.
- Special Funds
  - Emergency spending bill (i.e., Hurricane Recovery bill)
  - Infrastructure package



## Annual Budget – FY18:

- Admin's budget proposed major cuts to coastal programs; largely ignored by Congress.
- Big Question: What is total budget?
  - This depends on Tax Reform Package, Debt Ceiling.
- Congress passed a Continuing Resolution (CR) until December 8<sup>th</sup>
- CR leaves planning up in the air Fed agencies don't know how much they can spend

## Shore Protection Appropriations

Year	Pres. Budget	Enacted
FY14	<b>\$</b> 0	\$75 million
FY15	<b>\$</b> 0	\$45 million
FY16	<b>\$</b> 0	\$40 million
FY17	<b>\$</b> 0	\$45 million
FY18	<b>\$</b> 0	House - \$75 million Senate - \$50 million

• Most beach money comes from supplemental – e.g. Hurricane Matthew supplemental was \$250+ million



## **Emergency Supplemental**

- Hurricane Sandy \$60+ billion
- What will Harvey, Irma, Maria, Jose get?
  - Harvey already generated \$15 billion in aid just to FEMA, Community Development Block Grants, Small Business Association.





## **Emergency Supplemental Priorities:**

- 1. Funding to rebuild beaches and build authorized but unbuilt beaches.
  - Language specifying that beaches should return to pre-storm or better (i.e., fix FCCE implementation language from WRDA '14.).
- 2. Full federal funding for South Atlantic [Division] Coastal Study.
  - Authorized in 2016 WIIN Act, but lacks funding.
  - Provision for SACS to be fully <u>federally</u> funded no cost share.
- 3. Investment coastal research, data and modeling.
  - Efforts to improve preparedness for next storm.



## What the Infrastructure package MAY be:

#### • What's included?

- Standard infrastructure (Roads, Bridges, Airports, etc)
- Will "natural coastal infrastructure" beaches, dunes, wetlands be included?
- ASBPA is calling for \$5 billion for beaches, dunes and wetlands.

#### How is it paid for?

- Fed. Spending v. Public-Private-Partnership (PPP)/Tax Credit?
- How will it be "offset"? (Is it *new* spending, or does something else get cut?)

#### • Timing?

• Winter? 2018...? Depends on other priorities. Republicans willingness to work with Democrats.



### Call to Action:

#### Contact your Senators & Representative and ask:

- Rebuild Florida (and other state's) beaches after the 2017 Hurricanes.
- Support \$5 billion in direct spending to (re-) build federal, state and local beaches, dunes, wetlands and other coastal risk reduction in a Federal Infrastructure Bill.
- Support \$75 million for Shore Protection in the FY18 Budget.

## ASBPA's Government Affairs priorities:

#### • Investing in coastal infrastructure:

• Congress should invest \$5 billion over 10 years to (re-)build federal, state and local beaches, dunes, wetlands and other coastal risk reduction, erosion control, and habitat infrastructure.

#### Advancing coastal projects:

- The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) should implement the Beneficial Use of Dredged Material pilot program authorized in the WIIN Act (Sec. 1122)
- USACE, NMFS, and USFWS should improve regulatory and permitting timeframes.

#### Regional and state coordination:

• The South Atlantic Coastal Study should be funded and implemented.
